**ACADEMIC DECATHLON**

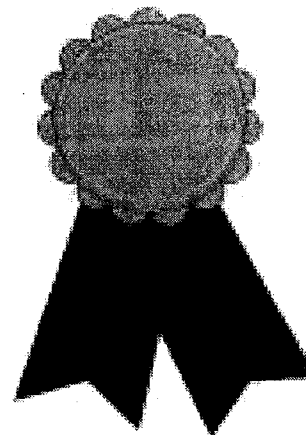
Congratulations to the Academic Decathlon for placing 2nd overall and 3rd in super quiz!
